25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the culture of Jesus' day, calculations of what honor was due to each person permeated social life. The disciples wondered also who amongst them would be considered to hold the position of "greatest."

Jesus then calls forward a child and teaches the Twelve that to receive a child in Jesus' name is to receive both Jesus and the One who sent him. We might easily fail to understand the significance of this action. In first-century Palestine, children were without status or power, possessing no legal rights. In this action, Jesus is teaching his disciples and us that when we serve the least ones among us, we serve Jesus himself. Who are the people without power or status in our society that Jesus is calling us to serve? Do we do so willingly? (LoyolaPress, Sunday Connection)

The Good News reveals that Jesus Christ came as one who serves, and that his disciples are called to follow in the work of humble service. We believe that his ultimate service was his free self-sacrifice by which he accomplished the work of salvation. He came not to be served but to serve others (Matthew 20:28).
