The First Sunday of Advent

In today's Gospel, Jesus warns his disciples against the fatigue that can emerge if one becomes consumed by the anxieties of daily life. Many families are too familiar with the kind of fatigue Jesus refers to here. We may be concerned about a family member's health, our job security, our children's education, or any number of other concerns. All these are important matters. Jesus does not promise an end to daily worries and fears, but he does teach his disciples that they will have the strength to withstand anxiety if they stay focused on him, remaining vigilant for his return and praying for strength to endure all tribulations. 


Happy New "Liturgical" Year!

This Sunday begins Liturgical Year C. Advent begins the new liturgical year and can lend itself as an opportunity to reflect on our spiritual resolutions.


How have you nourished your faith this past year? What re-SOUL-utions can you commit to this year? Here are
