The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Today's travellers rely much on using a GPS, Global Positioning System. When you want to go somewhere, you simply plug in the address and it will guide you as you travel. If you make a wrong turn, the GPS will adjust the directions to get you back on the right track. If you get lost, even from a detour, the GPS will help you find your way home.

In trying to find our way through life's journeys, God has given us a spiritual GPS to guide us. That guide is the Holy Spirit. When we don't know what to do or which way to turn, the Holy Spirit always points us in the right direction.

Many times we are faced with decisions or choices. Sometimes we rely on our feelings, which are self- serving. Sometimes we are led by "what everyone else is doing" which also may lead us in the wrong direction.

Jesus knew that we needed help in making the right decisions in life. He promised that God would send the Holy Spirit "to guide us in all truth." That means that the Holy Spirit will help us to understand God's Word which always points us in the right direction. It points us to Jesus who is "the Way, the truth, and the life."
