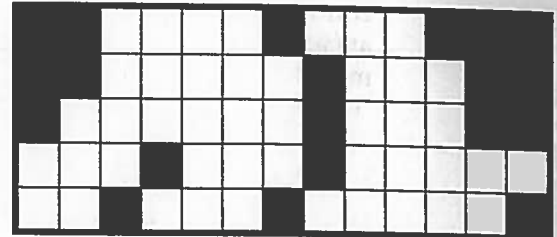


THE BOOK OF DEUTERONOMY

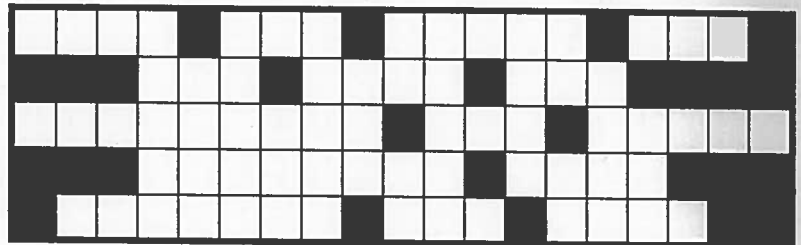

1. The Shema, found in Deuteronomy 6:4-9, is the most famous declaration of faith in the Old Testament. The Shema reminds us that we should . . .



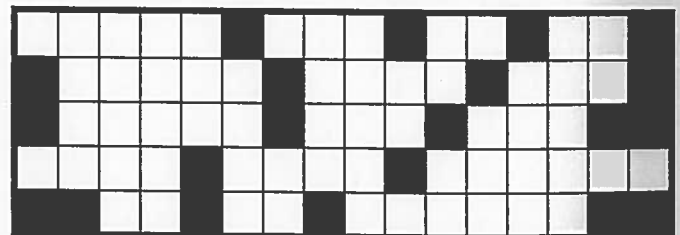
