

Fourth Sunday of Easter, May 3 (Good Shepherd Sunday) Alleluia!

Liturgical Color is White 1st Reading Acts 2:14, 36-41 2nd Reading 1 Pt 2:20-25

Ps 23:1-3, 4-6 Gospel Jn 10:1-10

The Gospel of John is known for the seven "I am" statements which two are heard today: "I am the Good Shepherd" and "I am the gate for the sheep." (John 10). John tells Jesus' message to help us know Jesus as our Savior who laid down his life for us and who is our loving protector. When we put our trust in Jesus, we do not live in fear, worry or anxiety. It is fitting to memorize and pray "The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want".

This day is also World Day of Prayer for Vocations.Use the prayer on the side with your family to pray for religious vocations as well as all vocations that serve God's people, especially the poor, the sick and the vulnerable.


